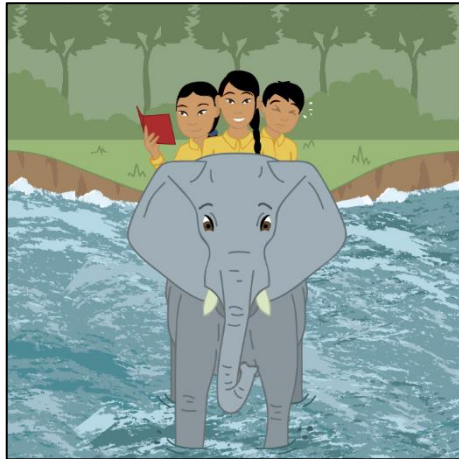


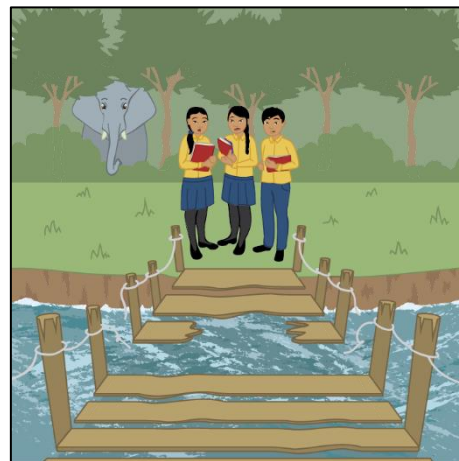
A story has a beginning, a middle and an ending. Pictures and other clues can tell us what a story is about even if we can't read all the words. In this session, you will put a story in the right order and make up a new story of your own!



1. Work in pairs. Here are some pictures that tell a story. It has a beginning, a middle and an ending, but they are in the wrong order. Put the pictures in the correct order.



Encourage your group to think about things happening in a *logical* order.



2. Could the pictures be in a different order? How would that change the story? Discuss your ideas with the group.



3. As a group, make up a story based on the pictures. Each person take it in turns to say one sentence of the story.

You could ask each student one of these questions:



- What are the characters called?
- Does the elephant have a name?
- Where are they going?
- Are there any other characters?
- How do the characters feel?
